#### Volunteers Creating a Future — DG Donald Cobb

Ramblings from the District and Around the World

October finds us still restricted from our normal lives as we continue to deal with the COVID-19 Virus. Restrictions have been eased recently: groups of up to 25 individuals are now allowed to meet indoors and groups of up to 50 individuals are allowed to meet outdoors. Even if we're allowed to meet, we need to ask ourselves if it is the right thing to do considering the health and safety of our members and those with whom we serve? We continue to hear that the virus may worsen during the fall and winter months and activities could be more restricted if that happens.

Most of us are tired of having to deal with COVID-19 and having to limit our activities. As Lions, we see we haven't been able to do service activities as we would like, nor have we been able to do fundraisers as we normally do. We may even wonder if other Lions are being restricted as we are. The answer to that is a resounding "Yes!"

I am writing this on a Sunday night and yesterday, Saturday morning at 7 am, I participated in a Zoom meeting with a group of fellow District Governors from around the world. The Lions in this meeting were placed together when we participated in our District Governor training in St. Charles, Illinois in February. We have met together by Zoom every two or three months since that time to share ideas as well as provide support for one another on our journey as District Governors. Our group consists of those of us from North Carolina as well as Lions from New York, Connecticut, and Pennsylvania, and also India, Egypt, Australia, and several European countries.

One of the things we do during these meetings is share things that are going on in our districts. During this Zoom meeting, we quickly realized that all of us are experiencing the same things. We found that no matter where we were from, a few Clubs were meeting in person, some were meeting by Zoom, and some were not meeting but trying to stay in touch with their members. Some District Governors had been able to do a few Club visits but many had not done any Club visits or only a very few visits. Clubs around the world were looking for creative ways to serve and meet the needs of their communities. We also found out that Lions within our group had been affected by COVID-19 in various ways. One District Governor from India has had six of his family members infected with COVID-19. We heard that Australia was on lock-down and no one could enter the country without being quarantined. Every one of us as individuals and as Lions were being affected by COVID-19 in one way or another.

So, what do we do? First, we continue to keep the health and safety of our members in the forefront of what we do and let that guide our actions and activities. We also shouldn't judge our fellow members if they are not comfortable participating in meetings or activities. We should look for safe ways in which we can serve our VIPs and communities. And we should continue to stay in touch with one another, whether it be by in-person meetings where we can wear masks and social distance, or by Zoom meetings, or by calling or emailing members to stay in touch. Remember, we are Lions and we look out for one another and those We Serve. We are, after all, "Volunteers Creating a Future" for those We Serve!



#### A Message from NCLI

We hope this email finds everyone healthy & safe during these trying times! Since March, Camp Dogwood & NCLI have experienced unprecedented economic challenges as the Covid-19 Pandemic has made it almost impossible to raise revenue through camp rentals and programs.

The Lions Clubs of North Carolina have had their ability to perform service projects and fundraisers severely restricted as well. We were very fortunate to receive a Payroll Protection Program grant of \$114,000 which paid for payroll, benefits & utility expenses for an 8-week period in May, June, and the first week of July. Understanding that since clubs have not been able to rely on their normal fundraising activities, our Brighter Visions kickoffs raised significantly less revenues this year than in years past.

The NCLI Board of Directors has authorized various cost saving measures in our ongoing efforts to remain financially sound until we and the country can recover from the pandemic. We have furloughed all part-time employees as well as 5 fulltime employees. In addition, the Mobile Eye Screening (MSU) program has been suspended through December 2020. This impacts 9 scheduled screenings as 2/3 of our screenings had already been canceled by the Lions Clubs themselves.

Our Matching Funds program will also be suspended effective September 20 through December as well. To offset the loss of Matching Funds to the clubs, you can contact our MSU Director Bryan Hoover for VSP Vouchers that will pay for eye exams and glasses at participating Optometrists. We have been using these vouchers for the last year in the MSU program and they work great! You will need to contact Bryan in advance of sending someone to the eye doctor as the patient will need to take the voucher with them when they visit the doctor. Bryan will mail the voucher to the club who will in turn give it to the patient.

In December, the NCLI Board will reevaluate our financial situation to determine if we will be able to reinstate the MSU & Matching Funds programs in January or extend the moratorium. I assure you that these actions have not been taken lightly and we are looking forward to getting back to normal as soon as possible! As we have taken significant measures to minimize our costs, we still have ongoing monthly expenses for power, water, phones, maintenance, and salaries of our remaining employees that must be paid.

Your Brighter Visions contributions and raffle ticket sales are needed now more than ever so please resolve to continue your clubs support of YOUR NCLI association!! You will be glad you did!! The Lions of North Carolina will persevere, and I am convinced we will come out of this pandemic stronger than ever! If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call or email me.

#### MOBILE SCREENING UNIT ANNOUNCEMENT

As many of you may have heard, the Mobile Screening Unit (MSU) and Matching Funds have been suspended until next year. On the MSU this past year we have been issuing VSP Vouchers to patients qualifying for the VSP Program. With the MSU being sidelined for the next few months, we want to still use these vouchers, so they are being made available on a first come first served basis. We have a very limited number of VSP Vouchers of various types, and we must use the appropriate voucher or it will be kicked out by VSP.

Every voucher is very specific as to what it covers and is listed in depth on each voucher type. If you have a need, please email me with your request and I will email you copies of all three voucher types for you to review (PLEASE NOTE THESE ARE NOT FOR USE AND ARE VOID).

We have one voucher that is Full Coverage, which covers a Comprehensive Eye Exam and single-vision or lined multifocal lenses. We have another voucher that covers Materials Only, which covers single-vision or lined multifocal lenses. The VSP voucher Sight for Students is for Students 19 years old and younger, it will also cover a Comprehensive Eye Exam and single-vision or lined multifocal lenses. You will need to look over the three different types of vouchers and decide which your patient qualifies for.

Once you determine which voucher type is correct for your patient you will fill out VSP Voucher Information Form, this form will need to be completed and emailed to <u>bryan@nclionsinc.org</u>. I will then process your request and if the applicant meets all criteria, the voucher will be mailed to the Lions Contact. You will then give the voucher to the recipient. These Vouchers are time sensitive as they expire on October 20, 2020. We plan to apply for more vouchers from VSP, but currently what we have is it.
