



District 31-I Cabinet Meeting November 7, 2020, ZOOM

Call to Order: 10am by DG Donald Cobb

DG Donald welcomed all the Lions and guests who attended our ZOOM cabinet meeting (in lieu of 2nd VDG Bill Mathers who was delayed in joining the meeting). VDG Bill was offered the opportunity to share remarks when he joined the meeting.

The invocation was given by District Chaplain Butch Conrad, and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by 1st VDG Wayne Kennerly.

District Tail Twister Chris Beck briefly shared a "Butch Conrad (Visiting Pastor) Story" with the attendees.

DG Donald addressed the group on the State of the District and the Multiple District in the time of COVID.

PDG David Shimberg was appointed parliamentarian.

The agenda was approved after a motion by Lion Angie Kaiser (second by PDG Jimmy Myers).

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as published after a motion by Lion Angie Kaiser (second by VDG Wayne Kennerly).

A financial report was presented by District Treasurer Kirby Matthews. A noteworthy item was the unexpected expense of mailing the District Directories at a cost of \$791.20 (due to the inability to meet in person for the Brighter Visions kickoff, where the bulletins are normally given out). The report was accepted after a motion by Lion Kirby (second by Lion Chris Beck).

OLD BUSINESS:

<u>Lions Reading Service Funds:</u> DG Donald reviewed the motion (tabled at the July meeting) to send Lions Reading Service funds of \$1,423.50 to the State Library for the Blind. DG Donald presented the group with four options that he had researched for the dispersal of these funds.

- 1. To donate them to the State Library for the Blind.
- 2. To donate them to NCLI for reading related and other uses.
- 3. To donate them to the North Carolina Reading Service.
- 4. To donate them to the Down East Radio Reading Service.

After discussion, which favored donating the funds to the North Carolina Reading Service, the best way forward was determined to be to bring the previous motion to a vote and defeat it and then to proceed with a new "clean" motion. DG Donald called for a vote on the motion to send \$1,423.50 to the State Library for the Blind. The motion was defeated. A motion by Lion Kirby Matthews (second by Lion Angie Kaiser) to send the Lions Reading Service funds of \$1,423.50 to the North Carolina Reading Service so that it supports and serves the VIPs in our area, as intended, passed.

<u>NAMI Update:</u> PDG George Culp spoke on NAMI (North American Membership Initiative). The Initiative builds the vision for the next two-to-three years with four areas of focus: New Members, New Clubs, Rejuvenating Existing Clubs, and Leadership Opportunities and Support. A ZOOM meeting to discuss progress is scheduled for November 18 at 8:30pm.

<u>Campaign 100 Report:</u> PDG Butch Conrad spoke of the friendly competition between Districts L, I, O, N, and S and gave a progress report for our district. We have 908 members. Our. District goal is \$175,000. Our current contributions total \$50,840. We have pledges totaling \$4,400.

<u>Brighter Visions Report:</u> Lion Christie Kestler reported that our current district contributions total \$40,843 which is 31% of our goal. She encouraged clubs to continue their efforts and volunteered to present to clubs in person or over ZOOM.

NEW BUSINESS:

Report and Recommendations from the Convention Committee: 1st VDG Wayne Kennerly reported that the weekend of March 21 is blocked off for us at Camp Dogwood. The recommendation of the Committee is to hold a one-day convention on the Saturday of that weekend. Rooms (at \$75/night) and breakfast (\$950) will be available for those wishing to arrive early and stay through. The lunch price is \$11.00, but VDG Wayne suggested that we might "bump that." Site Rental is \$150.00. A one-day convention in March (if COVID allows) was approved after a motion by PCC Tim Williams (second by PDG Jimmy Myers).

<u>Recommendation from Dist. Treasurer regarding club convention fees:</u> District Treasurer Kirby Matthews explained that since our "regular" convention is being replaced by a one-day event, expenses will be considerably less. Lion Kirby made a motion (second by PDG Dave Shimberg) to credit \$2.50 per member back to the clubs, to be subtracted from their second-half dues or credited to Brighter Visions in their club's name passed. Lion Christie and DG Donald will contact clubs to suggest the donation to Brighter Visions.

<u>Zone Chairperson Reports:</u>Zone 3 - Lion Angie Kaiser; Zone 4 - PDG Theresa Matthews for Lion Steve Cline; Zone 5 - VDG Wayne Kennerly for Lion Don Conner; Zone 6 - Lion Kathy Poirier.

Committee Chairperson Reports:

Constitution and Bylaws: DG Donald for PCC Bob Sprinkle – Items coming up on the NCLI level are name change from Executive Director to Executive Administrator, 1st and 2nd VDGs will automatically be their districts' members on the NCLI Board, and 2nd VDGs will (unofficially) select their Council Chair.

<u>Leader Dog</u>: Lion Antha Reid reported that our district is #1(in the MD) in Contributions to Leader Dog. Videos on the Leader Dog website were highly recommended.

<u>Fellowships and Partners</u>: Lion Fred Frances asked for continued support of these programs. Global Service: Lion Ron Rich asked all to keep reporting service.

<u>Peace Poster</u>: Lion Dianne Culp reported one entry to date (from North Davidson) and asked that any outstanding entries be sent to DG Donald by November 15.

Miscellaneous Items:

Mint Hill Lions Club announced a talk by author, Scott Syferton the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence to be held over the Mint Hill Facebook page on Tuesday, February 10 at 7:00pm. Linwood Lions Club announced turkey shoot fundraisers to be held on Nov. 20, Dec. 4, and Dec. 11, beginning at 6:00pm.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:48am.

Zone 6 Chairperson's report for the November 7, 2020

During the first quarter of this Lions year, I reached out to the clubs in our Zone, first to introduce myself and second to complete the training assignment the Zone Chairs were given to determine the current state of the Zone by doing an assessment. I spoke with each of the club presidents which gave me an opportunity to learn about the clubs and how they were dealing with the current restrictions due to Covid-19. In addition, I also was able to visit each of the clubs informally, again so they would have a chance to meet me in person.

We held our first Zone meeting in September. The topic for the meeting was *Focus on Service*. Lion Ron Rich, our District GST leader, took part in the meeting sharing some interesting ways for the clubs to provide service during these difficult times. The clubs were encouraged to focus on LCl's Global Causes if they weren't already. The causes may give them new opportunities to explore and help meet the growing challenges in their communities.

Our clubs have managed to hold some fundraisers during the past couple of months. The Mt. Pleasant club held a couple of successful broom sales. They also partnered with a food vendor, Cain's Corn Dogs. The vendor and the club made an arrangement that the club would receive a portion of the proceeds from the food sales. It proved to be a way to raise some money and there was little work involved for the club members. The Harrisburg club held a Fish Fry on the first Friday of October. This was their first time holding the event since March. It was a success and they are holding their next Fish Fry on Friday, November 6. The Odell club held their Fall BBQ in October as well. It was done as take-out only but it was not an issue. The line was non-stop and they ran out of food. Another successful event. Finally, the Concord club held a broom sale at the Odell BBQ. This also was a successful event.

Besides fund raisers, the clubs are working on service projects as well. Mt. Pleasant Lions helped to distribute face masks that had been made by Lion President Robert Harris's wife. The Harrisburg Lions are in the process of having a free library/Blessing Box in their community. They are refurbishing a 4-door refrigerator that will be used for this purpose. They also have a supply of medical equipment if people are in need. The Concord Lions have collected and donated food to Cooperative Christian Ministry and helped with a creek cleanup at Clear Water Studios. Members have also been encouraged to help Meals on Wheels by volunteering to be drivers. Lastly the club is working on launching a vision screening project for the community. They were able to purchase a Spot vision screener camera and are hoping to begin screening pre-school children if allowed in the next couple of months.
