

The Lions of North Carolina will convene April 28 through 30 at the North Raleigh Hilton. Registration form is on Page 9 of this newsletter and should be mailed with payment before April 20.

Our guest for the convention is 2nd International Vice President Gudrun Yngvadottir of Iceland, who will be the first woman President of Lions International in 2018-19 as we begin our 2nd Century of Service. Her husband Past International Director Dr. Jon Bjarni Thorsteinsson will also be in attendance.

Friday Family Fun Night will feature the Hall Sisters of North Carolina, who have made appearances at the Grand Ole Opry, the National Quartet Convention, and Carnegie Hall

On Friday, April 28 from 2:00 to 4 pm there

Continuing Lions Support Of Boys & Girls Homes

Boys and Girls Homes of NC Inc. has established a capital campaign to replace the furniture in the Lions Cottage. The Lions Cottage was the second cottage built on campus at Lake Waccamaw.

Total project cost is \$26,900 with sponsor opportunities available for Lions Clubs and individuals and will be recognized with permanent plaques.

Lions Clubs of NC funded a renovation project in 2011 but furnishings were not included at that time. The furniture used in the cottages across campus comes from specialty makers with durable qualities for its heavy use but still has a more homelike feel than most institutional furniture.

Sponsorship options include 14 sets of cushions

at \$216 each, two loveseats at \$823 each, two couches at \$865 each, four end tables at \$185, nine oak single beds at \$554, nine dressers at \$686, two dining room tables at \$1557, and five privacy panels at \$433. Other items are also on the need list.
