I can't say thank you enough to everyone who came out to help get the camp ready and sort glasses during Volunteer Week 2019. During the week of April 7-10, 95 Lions representing 42 Clubs donated a total of 1373 labor hours. During this week the Cates Room received a fresh coat of paint. Our Library was organized and audio books were cataloged and labeled. Buildings and fencing were pressure washed. The White Building received fresh screen, a new door and a much needed face lift. Flower beds were weeded, fresh flowers planted and mulch was installed around the property. A deck was added to the picnic shelter. This will provide a permanent place to keep the grills. Approximately 90,000 pairs of glasses totaling approximately 8500 pounds will be shipped to Illinois Recycling Center within the coming weeks. Fresh river rock and borders were placed around the duplexes.

Boy Scout Troop 823 stopped by on Tuesday night. The troop moved and installed the horse shoe pits above the Udovich dorm. This new location will offer shade the entire day for our VIPs. They also worked spreading river rock around the duplexes and the White dorm.



A LOOK BACK IN TIME



Who remembers the Ford Gumball Machines that were placed around your community to raise funds for civic organizations? If any of you

know the location of one of these that bears a Lions logo, please let Lion Willie Pruitt know where to find it. Find his contact information in the article to the right. Let's see if we can help him restart the program.

Lion Willie has invested a lot of time into researching the history of the program. Walter C. Huber of High Point, father of PID Ron Huber, was the originator of the program in NC and held the first franchise.

The Fordway program, and subsequent machines, were put in place in the 1941-1946 era and was in continuous operation until 2011/2012. I would like to re-institute the program.

First I would like to find what is out there, in service or at clubs, storage areas or any other location, and after that I can size up the issue.

Most machines are a light blue in color on light grey stands and should have a Lions Club sponsorship label. Some of the original sponsors were Denton, Lexington, and Thomasville in Davidson County. There were other participating clubs in Iredell, Randolph & Rowan Counties as well. I'm working with prior route servicer to find this equipment.






