

Dr. Wall suggests we each take the time to go out into our community and generate one senseless act of kindness. When asked for examples, he responded that he would provide no examples, it is entirely up to the individual.

By now, your club has elected its officers, and plans for the new year are being discussed. Items related to membership, leadership, and service to others should be the focus for your club. Keeping members engaged will provide the emphasis to attend, lead, and encourage others to join. The mission to serve others is the purpose of your recently elected service chair. What is CAMPAIGN 100, you ask? We all know, or should know, what Brighter Visions is, the charitable arm of NCLI which supports many familiar causes in our communities. LCIF is to International Lions what BV is to NC Lions. It is the charitable arm of Lions International.

If you think that means that all the funds are used in international locations, you would be wrong. North Carolina has received \$357,000 in grants from LCIF in recent months in the form of \$100,000 matching grant for Camp Dogwood (Industries for the Blind in Kinston provided the other half) and money for hurricane relief along the coast. Tornado and forest fire relief, as well as other matching gifts such as those to purchase Kid-Sight screening equipment, have come to NC.

Which brings me to the original question, "What is Campaign 100?" It is a three-year initiative of Lions International to raise \$300 million to continue to "empower service." It is similar to other capital campaigns that many of you will remember such as Campaign Sight First and Sight First II with specific focuses on river blindness and measles, respectively.

LCIF has set an aggressive goal. Clubs should strive to set their own realistic goals and make contributions before the program ends June 30, 2022. For those super performers, the "Model Club" designation will be available for an average donation of \$750/member over the 3-year period. For each \$1000 donation, a club or individual will be eligible to award a Melvin Jones Fellowship.

What do you need to do as Lions Clubs and individual Lions? Stretch a little. Step up your giving, without losing sight of the needs met by Brighter Visions. Add one new fundraiser, or designate one to benefit Campaign 100. Challenge members to make that extra donation. Solicit funds from individuals and businesses in your community. Give from a surplus in your treasury.

Don't forget LCIF. They have not forgotten the US states and territories. They have not forgotten us.


