1st VDG Donald Cobb — Does Reporting Service Really Matter?

One of the things we are asked to do as clubs is to report our service to Lions Clubs International. Many of our clubs do a great job of reporting; however, others often fail to report the great work they are doing in our communities. Does it make any difference if you are reporting your service projects to LCI?

There are actually nine reasons we should be reporting our service activities through MyLion on the LCI website. Let's take a look at these reasons to see the importance of reporting our service.

First of all, reporting service helps to captivate and connect with people in need. Reporting helps to shine a light on how and where Lions are making a difference across the world. Reporting also helps those in need find out where they can go for help.

Reporting service helps increase global awareness of the needs around the world and helps Lions identify opportunities to serve in areas that need help. Service reports also provide opportunities for partnerships with other organizations as these organizations see the impacts Lions are making in communities around the world and as a result want to join these efforts. Service reports allow us to share our efforts with others and to identify those things that can be shared with other Lions around the world. One small service project can also become the next initiative or program supported by Lions, but only if it is reported and promoted by Lions.

Reporting service activities also leads to a brighter future for Lions. Measuring our success leads to the setting of higher, more reachable goals and allows us to grow as an organization. Since people want to participate in activities that lead to good changes within our communities, the more others see our stories, the more they want to become members with our organization so our membership can grow as a result. In addition, if Lions see how other Lions are using funds from Lions Clubs International Foundation, they may be encouraged to apply for LCIF grants to fund local projects.

Finally, while most Lions are interested in service rather than recognition, when service is reported, Lions become eligible for various service awards. Rewards recognize the hard work of Lions and can motivate them to continue to strive for excellence in their service.

Reporting service activities does matter. It can help us tell our story, get Lions and other individuals and organizations involved in their communities, and help us understand the needs of others around the world. So, take a few moments and report your service. It can make a difference in our future!

These are just a few new help-ful hints for sighted people to keep in mind.


