

North Carolina Lions – District 31-I Cabinet Meeting

Wednesday, May 26, 2021 7:30pm



Zoom Conference Call

DGE Lion Wayne Kennerly called our meeting to order at 7:35pm.

PDG Lion Butch Conrad led our invocation.

PDG Lion Jimmy Myers led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2nd VDGE Lion Kathy Poirier welcomed all of us as "special guests".

DG Lion Donald appointed PCC Lion Bob Sprinkle to serve as Parliamentarian for this Cabinet meeting.

DG Donald requested a motion to approve the agenda for the meeting. Lion Kirby Matthews (Second by Lion Fred Francis) made a motion to approve the agenda. Motion was approved by a unanimous vote.

Cabinet Secretary Lion Michelle Gregory requested a motion to approve the minutes from the March 20th Cabinet meeting. 2nd VDGE Kathy Poirier (Second by Lion Janet Doub) made a motion to approve the minutes. Motion was approved by a unanimous vote.

Cabinet Treasurer Lion Kirby Matthews presented the treasurers report. See Attachments 1A – 1F.

Lion Angie Kaiser (Second by 2nd VDGE Lion Kathy Poirier) made a motion to approve the Treasurers Report. Motion approved by a unanimous vote.

Cabinet Treasurer Lion Kirby Matthews (Second by Lion Fred Francis) made a motion to pass a Resolution that was read at the Cabinet Meeting. See Attachment 2A. Motion approved by a unanimous vote. This resolution gives cabinet approval to continue using the bank on record and updates the signatories on the account.

Old Business:

Campaign 100 Report -

PDG Lion Butch Conrad reported he didn't have any new information to report. DG Lion Donald thanked Lion Butch for his hard work and efforts during this past Lion's year.

Brighter Visions Report -

Lion Christie Kestler, Brighter Visions Chair, wasn't present. DG Lion Donald spoke on her behalf. Our district has submitted \$79,835.60 to the Brighter Visions fund as of May 25th.

\$69K of that total is donations from clubs. The remainder is individual donations. Cabinet Treasurer Lion Kirby Matthews mentioned the district will be sending in \$1939 that clubs designated from their Convention Fee to go to Brighter Visions rather than be returned to them.

A discussion was held concerning monies budgeted for travel and other expenses for the cabinet officers that hadn't been used. PCC Lion Gary Steele (Second by PDG Lion Butch Conrad) made a motion to donate \$7K to Brighter Visions from the district. Motion approved by unanimous vote.

NAMI Report -

PDG George Gulp gave an overview and update of the plans of our NAMI program. He invited the NAMI group members to present a program to our clubs. Lion George mentioned recruiting new members by inviting them first to a service project.

New Business:

District Email Use Guidelines -

Lion Susan Mathers, who is now sending out our district emails, had asked DG Lion Donald if we had district guidelines for email distribution. After some research with our district Lions and not finding any guidelines, DG Lion Donald opened this topic for discussion.

PDG Lion George Culp (Second by Lion Angie Kaiser) made a motion that we publish the death of any Lion, including district and/or state Lions, along with their funeral arrangements. We will not publish club activities using the district email service. Motion approved by unanimous vote.

DG Lion Donald recommended that DGE Lion Wayne Kennerly might want to form a committee to pursue further details of the email distribution guidelines. DGE Lion Wayne agreed and plans to pursue this recommendation.

<u>District History –</u>

PDG Lion Jimmy Myers announced he will be our District and State Historian in the new Lion's year. North Carolina will be celebrating its $100^{\rm th}$ year with Lions clubs. PDG Lion Jimmy is requesting a written history from each club in our district. He will share more details concerning this request at a later date.

Zone 6 Chairperson's report for the May 26, 2021 Cabinet Meeting

Since the last report for Zone 6, the clubs that make up the Lions Council of Cabarrus County met for their fourth and final Zone meeting on Monday, April 19, 2021. The meeting focused primarily on wrapping up the year but also looking towards the future. The clubs discussed how they handle club officer transitions, ways they recognize their club officers and/or members and I shared some tools available through LCI that they might consider utilizing to help with their leadership and to assess their club operations to see if there are ways to change how things are done to encourage new and younger members to join.

A request from an individual needing help with paying for much needed hearing aids was brought to the attention of Lion President John Nunn from the Concord Club. He brought the request to the Council at the February Zone meeting. Because not all members of the Council were present at the meeting, an email was sent to the group explaining the request and asking to see if they Council could help in some way. The Council was able to provide \$700 towards the cost of the hearing aids which helped to pay the balance of the cost.

After the April Zone meeting, another request was received from someone needing cataract surgery on both eyes. This request first came to the attention of PDG Terry Cauble from the Mt. Pleasant Club. PDG Terry contacted me and I in turn reached out to the Lions Council to see if there was a way to help. Some possible options have been offered to the Council and hopefully a decision will be made soon.

The clubs in Zone 6 have been able to hold some fundraisers but also had to postpone others until later in the year. Things will be ramping up for those clubs who put out flag displays for the upcoming holidays. Service projects are taking place as well.

Lastly, I completed my official club visitations as Zone Chair. On April 27th I visited the Odell Club. On May 4th I attended the monthly meeting of the Concord Club. This meeting was the first one in person since the pandemic began. At both clubs I spoke about the upcoming International Convention, reviewed District Governor Donald's goals and encouraged participation in NAMI.

The Boys and Girls Homes at Lake Waccamaw are creating new programs to meet the needs of the changing environment. Their journey is leading them to become a leading child welfare services provider.

The Rye Foundation in Winston-Salem recently gave Boys and Girls Homes \$10,000 for music and leadership. The foundation's name is derived from its priority funding areas – religion, youth, and education.

The Board of Trustees recently voted to change the structure of the organization by adding four Advisory Councils. They include Civic Clubs, Boys and Girls Homes Alumni, Community and Pastoral. The four new structures will allow for more inclusivity within the communities to shape the direction of Boys and Girls Homes.

On March 28, Rotarians around the world had the opportunity to attend the Boys and Girls Homes Virtual Rotary Day. Attendees were as near as Wilmington and as far away as Egypt, Greece and Turkey. The virtual tour included the Rotary Cottage and Lake House for teen moms. Last year's Rotary Day had to be cancelled because of the pandemic.

In addition to financial contributions, an Amazon Wishlist was established to allow individuals and clubs to donate specific items that will help the cottage.

The vision and mission of Boys and Girls Homes have remained constant since their founding. The global pandemic has changed how things are done and has created new challenges. Boys and Girls Homes depend on support of individuals and civic organizations.
