The clubs that I've visited have been so welcoming. It is good to see that our District is starting to move forward after such difficult times these past several months. Some clubs are not meeting in person because of our current circumstances but that's all right. We all have to do what is comfortable and safe for our members.

Last year when I was a Zone Chair, our first meeting focused on Service. Since International President Douglas X. Alexander's theme is *Service from the Heart, let's take a few moments to think about what we as Lions do and where we are going with our service for our communities.*

Do you realize that as Lions, everything you strive to accomplish as you serve your community is part of a global service journey? You may think that what your club is doing is small and only important to those you are helping locally. However, what you are doing may be of significance to other Lions Clubs around the world. Please take a moment and think about where your focus lies serving those in need. Is your service project related to one of Lions Clubs International's five global causes? Do you know what those five causes are?

For over 100 years, people have associated the Lions with preventing avoidable blindness and helping those who are blind or visually impaired have a better quality of life. This is quite true; so **Vision** is a global cause. As other challenges have impacted people around the world, we as Lions are now focusing on other areas. These challenges are **Diabetes** (for people diagnosed with this disease, we work reducing the prevalence of the disease and improving quality of life), **Hunger** (helping people have access to healthy foods), **Environment** (improving the well-being of our communities through protecting and restoring the environment), and **Childhood Cancer** (helping those diagnosed with this disease survive).

Many of you may already be focusing on these global causes for your service projects. If not and you're looking for something new to engage your members and/or invite non-members to help your club serve, think about these challenges and see if there is a new opportunity to help those in need in your community.

Remember, whatever your club is doing for service projects, be sure to report your service activities through **MyLion**. Reporting service promotes your club as being a healthy club, demonstrates how you're making a difference in your community, shows global engagement and impact to prospective partners of LCI and potentially may become the next global initiative for Lions everywhere. Thank you for continuing to follow the Lions motto, **We Serve!**

VIP Fishing Tournament Cancelled

The 2021 NC Lions VIP Fishing Tournament, scheduled for this fall, has been cancelled due to public health concerns related to the coronavirus. The tournament's governing board made the difficult decision in the interest of protecting its vulnerable participants and volunteers.

If you have already submitted for application and paid for your registration, you will receive a refund. The decision was not made easily or lightly. After consultation with officials at the Dare County Health Department, along with social service workers, group leaders from across North Carolina, and statewide Lions, tournament organizers expressed concern that the safety of our participants and volunteers could not be

guaranteed due to the large number of people who typically attend the event.

The tournament was scheduled for Oct. 18-20. "To host an event of this magnitude takes months of planning, preparation, and fund raising," said Gwen White, executive director. "While we are deeply disappointed with the decision to cancel the event for a second year in a row, we must keep the health of everyone involved foremost in our concerns." Billed as the world's largest fishing tournament for the blind and visually impaired, the event typically attracts more than 900 from across North Carolina, along with visually impaired participants from seven other states and Canada.

Service in the Time of Corona

Business as usual for the Lions Clubs and every other organization and household came to a jarring halt in March of 2020. Almost everything in our clubs has had to find a new way of operation. It is hard enough to figure out how to do fundraising, but how do we touch the lives of those we serve and keep them and ourselves safe? Several clubs have held events such as food drives with low physical contact – parking a truck or trailer in high-traffic areas with one or two attendants. Then goods can be placed into the truck by those donating. This can also work for a clothes drive or collections of toiletries or household goods. Family Resource Centers or church projects can surely use the additional donations. The isolation of the elderly and our Visually Impaired Persons is at an all time high. Mailing cards or making phone calls can go a long way to helping them feel connected and not neglected.

Many are using delivery systems for restaurants and grocery stores. Offering to make a pick up and deliver to their front door can be done with limited physical contact and would mean the world to those on limited income or with even more limited transportation options. Providing packaged snacks to a fire department, police station, or breakroom at a hospital would certainly be appreciated by our first responders.
